Every year since 2007 Artelia has devoted part of its profits to supporting humanitarian projects around the world. In 2013, a total of €200,000 was allocated to such causes.

2013 saw a record number of 17 employees taking part in volunteering. On behalf of the associations and the many local people who benefited from their efforts, we would like to thank them for offering their time and being ready to help, for their involvement and enthusiasm, and for contributing to bringing hope to others.

The recent news is that the Board of Directors decided on 16 February 2014 to extend the Foundation for a further three years. 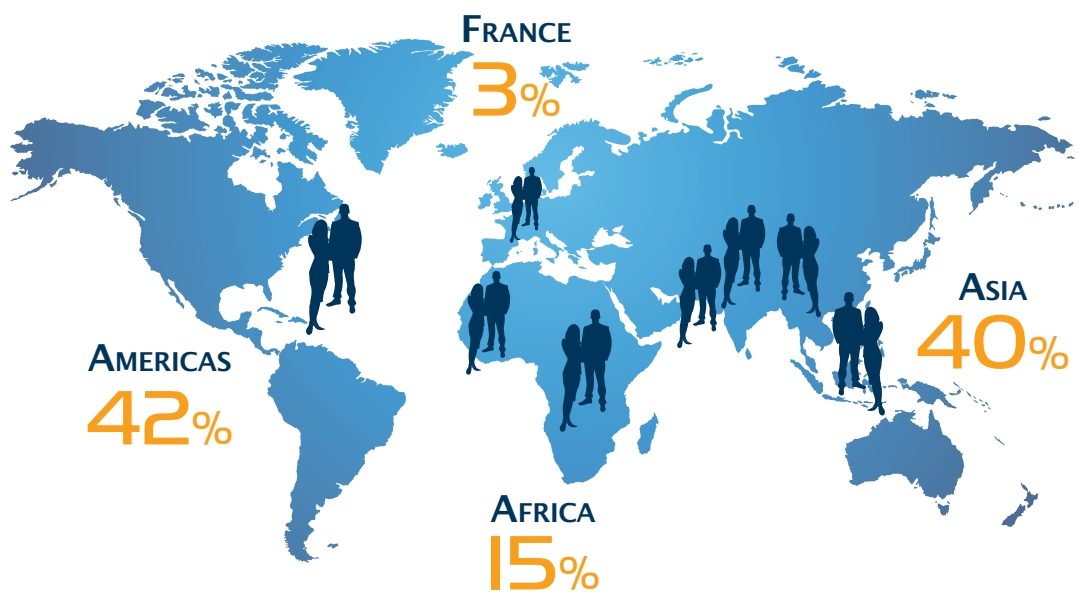

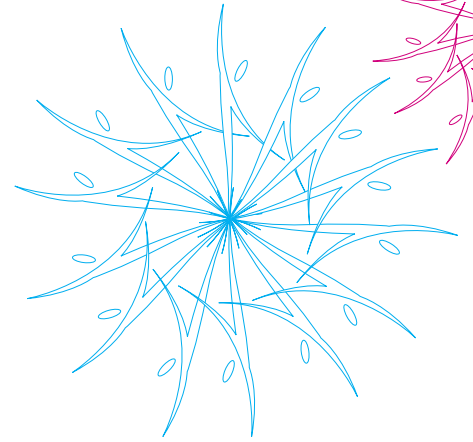
