We hope this latest annual report is enlightening.







Emergency fund

Supporting humanitarian response in direct contact with the affected populations

In 2023, the Artelia Foundation Board of Directors renewed its commitment by voting in favour of granting a €50,000 emergency fund. This amount is earmarked for aid for the victims of humanitarian crises in Libya, Morocco, Syria, Turkey and Ukraine.



Aid for victims of massive flooding in Libya

Storm Daniel struck in September 2023, causing historic flooding in eastern Libya. Derna was particularly hard hit with entire neighbourhoods devastated and over 30,000 displaced individuals according to IOM. Two dilapidated dams collapsed during the storm, resulting in tragic human losses. A grant was awarded to the Libyan Red Crescent to deliver assistance to survivors.

Aid for earthquake victims in Morocco

The provinces of Al Haouz and Taroudant in Morocco were the most affected by the earthquake that hit on 8 September 2023, causing many buildings to collapse. A grant was awarded to the Moroccan Red Crescent to supply water, food, medical equipment and shelter. A second grant was awarded to AFEMAC to support the victims in Chichaoua and its region.

Aid for earthquake victims in Turkey and Syria

On 6 February 2023, a 7.8-magnitude earthquake rocked southeast Turkey and neighbouring Syria.

The Artelia Foundation grant helped the association Acted distribute food and hygiene kits for displaced families from these devastated areas.

Emergency response following the destruction of the Nova Kakhovka dam in Ukraine

The Artelia Foundation contributed to funding the Ukraine programme of the NGO Solidarités International which aims to provide an emergency response following the destruction of the Nova Kakhovka dam. Bottles, water filters and hygiene kits were supplied to the region and mobile water treatment plants were installed and brought into operation in isolated villages.





Antenna France works to fight child malnutrition by locally producing and distribution Spirulina, while also promoting good nutritional practices. In partnership with local stakeholders, 70% of the Spirulina produced is sold while the remaining 30% is donated to children and pregnant women suffering from malnutrition or anaemia. In this context, the Artelia Foundation received an appeal to support the Spirulina production farm in Agou Nyogbo, Togo, in operation since 2011 with an annual production capacity of one tonne. Artelia contributed to the installation of a borehole to guarantee good-quality and more stable groundwater supply. Two Artelia volunteers assisted the association in the choice of equipment and technical solutions and monitored the borehole construction works.





The mission of Enfants d'Asie is to improve hygiene conditions for schools in Chom Ong and Khokka in Laos by providing access to water. The Artelia volunteers conducted an exploratory mission to assess the project's technical aspects, which led to the production of a field report setting out the budget and technical guidelines. The Artelia Foundation has since continued to support the association by monitoring the works.





Namaste La Maison des Enfants works to improve living conditions for children at an orphanage in Kathmandu, Nepal, providing support from their schooling to their employment in the world of work. Since 2012, the Artelia Foundation has supported several development projects aimed at ensuring access to drinking water and improving the arrangement of spaces. In March 2023, two Artelia volunteers conducted a feasibility study and a budgetary study for an extension of the orphanage building. They also provided their expertise with regard to insulating the walls of three rooms to accommodate infants, using organic materials.



The goal of the project supported by the Artelia Foundation is to supply renewable and accessible energy to the École Technique de Hammana school in Lebanon. Led by the association IECD Lebanon as part of the Schneider Electric Foundation's Scholar Grid programme, in partnership with ESF, this project aims to improve the school's energy autonomy, thus optimising conditions for the schooling of its 300 pupils. With this in mind, two Artelia experts provided technical training to teachers and students on the buildings' energy audit and the design of the photovoltaic system.







The Artelia Foundation was contacted by the French Salvation Army to design, as part of a skills-based philanthropy initiative, a brochure presenting the Glycines housing and social rehabilitation centre (CHRS) in the Gard department of France, which provides accommodation for people living in unstable conditions.

Our collaboration led to a graphic design in line with the expectations of the French Salvation Army Foundation, taking into account the specificities of the beneficiaries it helps.

Roofing surveys for 3 school campuses

? Cambodia

The association Pour un Sourire d'Enfants runs educational programmes from early childhood to vocational training in Cambodia. To secure the future of the Phnom Penh centre and user comfort, two Artelia volunteers conducted roofing surveys at three campuses to identify leaks, disrepair and/or defects. Technical solutions and the implementation of a works programme with task prioritisation and financial estimations were also recommended.







Conscious of the importance of preserving our planet for future generations, the Artelia Foundation is committed to an approach that favours the environment. This approach encompasses a series of concrete, proactive actions aimed at both reducing our ecological footprint and promoting sustainable practices. We support projects run by our non-profit partners contributing to environmental protection and the fight against climate change through initiatives to protect biodiversity and that promote the use of renewable energy and sustainable management of natural resources. Given that those most vulnerable are also the least prepared, and yet are the most likely to suffer the consequences of the environmental crisis we are facing, we concentrate particularly on projects with a global approach that take into account environmental and social issues.

Entrepreneurs du Monde supports the social and economic integration of people living in unstable conditions around the world by providing them with training in climate-friendly agricultural techniques and by providing assistance throughout the entire agricultural value chain. In collaboration with the Artelia Foundation, a skills-based philanthropy mission was initiated to optimise the electric design of the Ekofoda resource centre in central Togo. This centre, spanning 4.5 hectares, is equipped with dedicated education and agriculture infrastructures. The expansion of its activities requires its solar equipment to be adapted to guarantee access to energy.



France

The association **ÉCORCE** works to promote the ecological transition in the construction sector through the creation of an eco-centre, a hub of information, demonstration, experimentation and training in ecological techniques. Its goal is to improve both the quantity and quality of energy renovations, as well as the environmental performance of new constructions. With this in mind, an Artelia volunteer carried out an energy audit as part of a skills-based philanthropy mission with a view to the thermal renovation and interior redesign of an old building selected to house this project.



Plvory Coast

By helping communities plan their actions in the fields of waste, sanitation and the circular economy, the association Moi Jeu Tri contributes to the ecological transformation of territories through education and training in Ivory Coast. The Artelia Foundation supports the Moi Jeu Forme programme by providing three-year funding and by participation in the training of teams from non-profit associations to ensure that waste management, water and sanitation programmes are successfully rolled out.



The association AFEMAC helps develop projects to optimise and conserve the use of water, a precious resource in the arid province of Chichaoua in Morocco. The association takes actions on many fronts: restoration of drinking water networks to secure access to water, rehabilitation of rainwater collection basins, water from which is used for agriculture and domestic uses, and training and awareness-raising among villagers with regard to good water management and agroecology techniques. Two Artelia volunteers shared their skills and know-how to help the association with projects to collect and re-use rainwater and waste water for irrigation, and to improve water and energy installations in rural areas.



Five winners of the call for projects: "Taking action for an energy transition that leaves no one behind"

As part of our call for projects "taking action for an energy transition that leaves no one behind", our goal is to support projects aiming to combat energy poverty and to promote access to renewable and sustainable energy for vulnerable populations.

The applications were examined by a committee of experts based on criteria such as feasibility, environmental impact, sustainability and ability to mobilise stakeholders. In addition to the environmental aspect, particular emphasis was placed on the social benefits of the projects. The five winners selected received total funding of €80,000 as well as technical support in the form of solidarity leave or skills-based philanthropy to implement their projects.






Support for twenty local businesses towards a sustainable energy transition.

Burking Faso

Improving access to healthcare by supplying healthcare buildings in Sangoulema with electricity thanks to the installation of solar panels.



Creation of a solar school in partnership with the university of Koudougou to provide training in photovoltaic systems and to raise the awareness of the community on energy consumption.



Creation of an online training course to develop the skills of those working on the ground to help households in situations of energy poverty renovate their homes.

Going green

A large number of Artelia employees took part in the My Little Planet Challenge and the Artelia TrashTag Challenge, two initiatives that illustrate our commitment to preserving our environment.



Some 500 volunteers took up this ecological challenge over three weeks with the aim of reducing our ecological footprint while expanding our knowledge of a wide range of environmental subjects. The 8,161 challenges completed, notably focused on mobility, food and waste management, produced impressive results:

- 3,800,000 litres of water saved
- 21,887kg of CO, eq emissions avoided
- 520kg reduction of waste



The third edition of this waste collection operation, organised by the Artelia Foundation and the Artelia Group's Mobility, Environment and Sustainable Development Committee, drew more than 1,000 participants worldwide. This action highlights our collective commitment to combating environmental pollution and protecting our ecosystems.

Sports Challenge

The Artelia Foundation Sports Challenge is a unique opportunity to give meaning to the sports activities of the Artelia teams. Thanks to the outstanding performances of our participants, €15,000 were donated to the associations AFEMAC, KSH and Aux Captifs, la libération! A huge thank you to the 99 participants who clocked up almost 12,380km to demonstrate their commitment to sport and solidarity. Much more than statistics alone, these figures attest to the individual and/or collective efforts that contributed to supporting a common cause.



The Artelia Foundation Sports Challenge transforms the kilometres covered as part of official sports events (running, cycling, swimming) by our employees into donations made to three different associations every year.



A remarkable display of generosity from the Artelia employees at over thirty Artelia sites that organised collections of toys and/or basic necessities for local partner associations. This mobilisation brought 2023 to an end on a high note under the banner of generosity. These initiatives have a twofold objective: providing a response to social and environmental challenges. They encourage the circular economy and solidarity, therefore contributing to combating wastage and social insecurity.
