
In this context, and with an increased budget, the Artelia Foundation is standing firm in its commitment to support those who are providing responses to the current crises and fragilities.





Focus on our actions in Madagascar

The Artelia Foundation remains committed to sustainable and inclusive development though numerous initiatives, in Madagascar and the Philippines in particular,

In Madagascar, our actions are centred on developing agroecology, building local skills in hydrology, and improving access to energy. These projects, put in place with local actors, illustrate our vision of inclusive and lasting development. During an on-site assignment in July 2024, Jade Becret, Operations Manager of the Artelia Foundation, met with the local partners and direct beneficiaries and was able to assess the impact of the projects supported locally and identify new opportunities to work together.

The 3 winners of our Engage Award 2024, encouraging students' solidarity and environmental initiatives!

In 2024, we launched the Engage Award for the first time to encourage solidarity and/or environmental protection initiatives led by students, within the framework of their higher education programmes or their voluntary activities. Three projects were rewarded with grants for the winners, as well as support in the form of skills-based philanthropy or solidarity leave for the project leaders.



The HEAL self-build project aims to construct selfsufficient and low-tech ecological housing through a participatory effort at the L'Hermitage site, a rural innovation third space. HEAL – for 'Habitat Ecologique Autonome Low-tech' – thus responds to a housing need and promotes new self-build practices. The goal? Create ecological and easily replicable housing, encourage self-building and alternative construction and promote more virtuous lifestyles.



BleuAtlantiC is an inter-disciplinary research project designed from start to finish by five students at the Ecole Normale Supérieure - PSL. It consists of a grassroots campaign in Guadeloupe starting in March 2025. The project is based on three complementary lines of research (biology, chemistry and physics), and aims to study the response of mangrove ecosystems to the consequences of climate change. It goes hand in hand with a mediation campaign that seeks to open up science and encourage young people to participate in environmental science research while raising awareness of climate protection among the general public.



The project implemented by La Solidarité Internationale focuses on building emergency housing in Argentina's and Paraguay's capital cities, where the poverty index and inflation have risen dramatically in recent years. Fundraising is centred around organising non-profit events with the goal of being able to build this housing and to encourage social cohesion and ties among the beneficiary families.

Disability

A special Foundation fund to support a new cause

Thanks to the generosity of a former Artelia Group executive, the Foundation has chosen to lend its support to a new major cause: the integration of people with a disability and help for family caregivers. This financial aid supports projects aimed at:

- Improving living conditions for people with a disability and their families;
- Addressing basic needs not yet covered;
- Facilitating social and professional integration;
- Strengthening social cohesion and inclusion.

Through this commitment, the Foundation wishes to support initiatives working towards a more inclusive society, where everyone, whatever their difficulties, can find their place and reach their full potential.

Comme les Autres works to assist people with a motor disability following an accident, providing social support galvanised by sport and exhilarating experiences. We've chosen to support the first year of implementation of the organisation's pilot programme "Proches aidants" for family caregivers. Family members also need support in their personal reconstruction process, and the programme aims to help them with this important stage.

DEVELOPMENT AID

Development aid is central to the Artelia Foundation's actions, which are guided by the values of inclusion, equality, equity and respect for human dignity. In 2024, we once again focused our support on concrete initiatives aiming to improve the living conditions of the most vulnerable populations by addressing their basic needs, such as access to education, health care and water.



To compensate for the frequent power cuts caused by climate issues and the local grid distribution, which create difficulties for school activities, Tecnologie Solidali installed a photovoltaic system for Heaven Hill Academy in Nepal to enhance the school's sustainability and self-sufficiency. A team from Artelia Italy assisted the project team with the dimensional design of the system prior to the installation works.

AMD works to improve access to health care for the most disadvantaged populations. As part of the consortium project 'Sur la piste du caméléon' (On the Trail of the Chameleon), in the Kedougou region, plans are in place to renovate and reconstruct two health centres in Fongolimbi and Ethiolo. The Artelia volunteer who travelled to the site provided technical assistance consisting in making recommendations for the renovation work on the Ethiolo centre and producing the plans for the new Fongolimbi centre.

ENVIRONMENT

In the face of growing challenges connected with climate change and preservation of natural resources, the Artelia Foundation stepped up its environmental actions in 2024. Thanks to innovative initiatives and collaborative work, we have supported projects aimed at protecting ecosystems, promoting sustainable practices, and raising awareness about environmental issues. These actions form part of a holistic approach combining ecological and social responsibility.








France

Ares is a social integration group working to help people living at the margins of society (young people with no qualifications, the homeless, people with a disability, detainees, refugees, etc.) return to work by providing suitable support and employment. The R4 project, for 'Réinsérer, Réemployer, Recycler, Réutiliser' (Reintegrate, Re-employ, Recycle, Reuse), which aims to create a facility for the reuse of construction materials (wood and glass), provides employability support, enabling 25 individuals to find placements within circular economy activities, in addition to processing more than 350 tonnes of glass and recovering nearly 100 tones of furniture. Two Artelia experts assisted the organisation with the development of its circular economy activities.



Cœur de Forêt is an organisation working for environmental and social justice by restoring the precious balance between forests and people. The project supported aims to sustainably preserve and restore natural resources through reforestation campaigns. The project also aims to help local producers implement climate change adaptation efforts, in particular through the adoption of agroecology practices.

An Artelia volunteer conducted a study of irrigation systems to allow the organisation to optimise its infrastructure in line with the socioeconomic context in Madagascar.



France

In 2020, Eaux et Rivières de Bretagne, an organisation actively campaigning for the protection of water as a common resource, launched the 'Refuge Grenouille' operation in response to the threatened extinction of almost half of the world's amphibian species. The organisation has created the 'Refuge Grenouille' ('frog refuge') pond label with the aim of providing tools and advice to protect and safeguard amphibians. The label is intended for the general public: private individuals, businesses and local and regional authorities.

Two Artelia graphic designers developed the communication materials for this operation in order to highlight its importance.

The French Salvation Army has been committed to fighting all forms of exclusion and working for the integration of everyone in society for over 140 years. We have lent our support to the French Salvation Army in reducing the carbon footprint of its 21 buildings in France. To achieve this goal, our Artelia experts worked on an overall property action plan, focused on various energy performance improvement and good practice recommendations. Their aim? Achieving the energy consumption reduction targets set out in the French tertiary sector decree for the buildings concerned, but also its other buildings as part of a pro-active approach.



Winners of the call for projects

"Taking action to protect biodiversity and the climate"

In 2024, as part of its Call for Projects "Taking action to protect biodiversity and the climate", the Artelia Foundation supported organisations working to protect the living environment and combat climate change. The Selection Committee, composed of Group employees and external experts, determined six winners from the more than 100 projects received, allocating a total amount of €80,000 between them.



Coopération Atlantique Guinée 44





"Sauvons les forêts et la biodiversité du Pilat"

aims to acquire around a hundred hectares of wooded land under Real Environmental Obligation ('ORE') contracts with the Pilat Regional Natural Park. Robin du Bois is thus working to generate light-flooded, diversified and terraced forests that encourage the development of varied vegetation conducive to wildlife, but also to raise awareness among forest owners, families and the general public more broadly with regard to safeguarding forests and protecting biodiversity in the Pilat mountain range in Rhône-Alpes.



"SONEYA 2 – Kindia, Territoire de responsabilité
écologique et climatique" takes a long-term approach
in close collaboration with local authorities. The goal
of Guinée 44? Sustainably build the region's ecological
management capacities through reforestation and
the replanting of plant cover on the most degraded
riverbanks and spring heads. The project also
focuses on supporting environmentally friendly
energy practices and implementing local ecological
governance to bolster ecosystem resilience.



"Gestion Intégrée de la ressource forestière et promotion d'activités génératrices de revenus

durables" aims to sustainably restore and protect the forest cover in Zaffé, Benin. Planting trees, promoting more sustainable agricultural systems and developing economic activity are central to the Experts Solidaires project, with the goal of fostering activities that generate stable incomes.





The project "L'agroforesterie pour restaurer la biodiversité locale et les écosystèmes sur les fermes" run by Fermes d'Avenir consists in planting trees at the heart of five agricultural systems in order to recreate wildlife habitats and protect biodiversity more generally. In order to achieve this goal, the Fermes d'Avenir organisation supports and trains farmers in the design, financing and implementation of their agroforestry projects.

"Le Jardin Pédagogique du Moulin de Pont Rû" is a place for people to connect and learn about nature. The aim of the project is to provide a space to raise awareness and introduce people from all backgrounds to agroecology and permaculture. Through a variety of themed workshops adapted to each season and the age bracket and target audience, the Moulin de Pont Rû aims to make an active contribution to environmental education.






With an inventory of more than 550 coral species, the project "Protection et restauration de 5 ha de récifs coralliens" run by the Fondation de la Mer is being deployed within the world's most diverse area, in the Indonesian province of Raja Ampat. It aims to protect and restore degraded coral reefs while creating jobs for local villagers who are being trained in diving and reef restoration operations.

SOCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL INTEGRATION

In 2024, the Artelia Foundation remained committed to social and professional integration, with the goal of reducing inequalities and empowering the long-term unemployed. Through targeted partnerships and concrete initiatives, we have supported projects that provide job opportunities, training and assistance, thereby helping rebuild the beneficiaries' confidence and future prospects.









Taking part in the discussion workshops on the energy audit processes for families affected by energy poverty was a truly enriching experience. Being able to share in this way was invaluable as it helped us discover an entirely new approach, in a context far removed from our normality. P France

The organisation Culture Prioritaire works to promote equal opportunities and the educational and professional attainment of young people from priority neighbourhoods, from third-year secondary level to higher education. Our volunteers presented engineering, communication and human resources professions to the young people supported by the organisation, both on the Artelia premises and at job forums. The goal? Giving them a taste of the working world through first-hand accounts, expanding their professional horizons and encouraging students to gain a real insight into the job positions presented.



The organisation **IECD**, which has been working since 1998 towards human, economic and social development, asked us to audit the bakery and pastry-making school in Thu Duc City, Vietnam, for disadvantaged young people. The School aims to train students, recruited based on economic and social criteria, not just professional skills, and encourage young people to take their future into their own hands and become responsible and socially integrated adults. The Artelia Vietnam employees drew up a list of recommendations regarding works to be carried out, and this support is ongoing in order to help the IECD with the implementation and supervision of the works.



9 Madagascar

The Programme Solidarité-Eau (pS-Eau) is a French multi-actor network working to guarantee access to water and sanitation for all, as well as to promote the sustainable management of water resources in developing countries. In Madagascar, in partnership with the Ran'Eau network, training courses were run to train students from Diego, Tulear and Fianarantsoa in catchment basin management and urban sanitation. Following these sessions that took place in the spring of 2024, 12 students were selected to participate in a symposium to present their projects in Antananarivo in September. These exchanges allowed them to meet professionals in the sector and to visit a green urban sanitation demonstration site.

Fun Être sur L'Île aims to educate, develop, promote and foster actions and/or personal growth projects in various forms, advocating openness and inter-generational and inter-cultural sharing in Seine-Saint-Denis. The installation of a kitchen at the Lil'Ô site, the plans and specifications for which were drawn up by an Artelia employee, now enables the organisation to hold cooking and herb and medicinal plant processing workshops alongside the area's residents. The recipe for this

plant processing workshops alongside the area's residents. The recipe for this success? The combination of healthy eating, collective unity and reconnecting with nature.

Our solidarity events

In 2024, we organised our traditional TrashTag Challenge along with a whole month of solidarity and engagement in December entitled 'Décembre Solidaire'. Décembre Solidaire was based around 3 events: Engagement Week, Giving Tuesday and the final sprint of the Sports Challenge.



Held from 9 to 13 December, this dedicated week allowed Artelia employees to spend an entire day with an organisation close to their place of work, and thereby contribute actively to a cause and lend their knowledge to the organisation of their choice! Outreach patrols, participative projects and planting, as well as support for returning to employment and food sorting... In total, 76 people contributed 535 hours of their time to 18 organisations!



Run from 3 to 10 December, Giving Tuesday consists in collecting donations for a local non-profit organisation. Each participating country was able to adapt its operation to the local context. This year, the focus was primarily on collecting games and toys to help the organisations in question with their end-of-year activities. Rolled out at some thirty sites worldwide, the initiative was a huge success! We were also able to provide financial support to two organisations that supply toys and edutainment materials to children in hospital: Petits Cadeaux pour Gros Bobos and Ludopital.



Run throughout the year, the Sports Challenge allows Artelia employees to transform the kilometres they clock up during official races into donations to one of the three non-profit organisations supported each year by the Artelia Foundation. In December, all kilometres were doubled, creating a gripping final sprint: 2,004 km were doubled to give a total of 22,498 km covered in 2024!



We organised the 4th edition of the TrashTag Challenge for World Environment Day on 5 June. More than 1,000 people took part in this trash picking operation around 28 sites in France, Spain, Italy, Canada, Germany, the UK, the Philippines, Vietnam and Madagascar.
